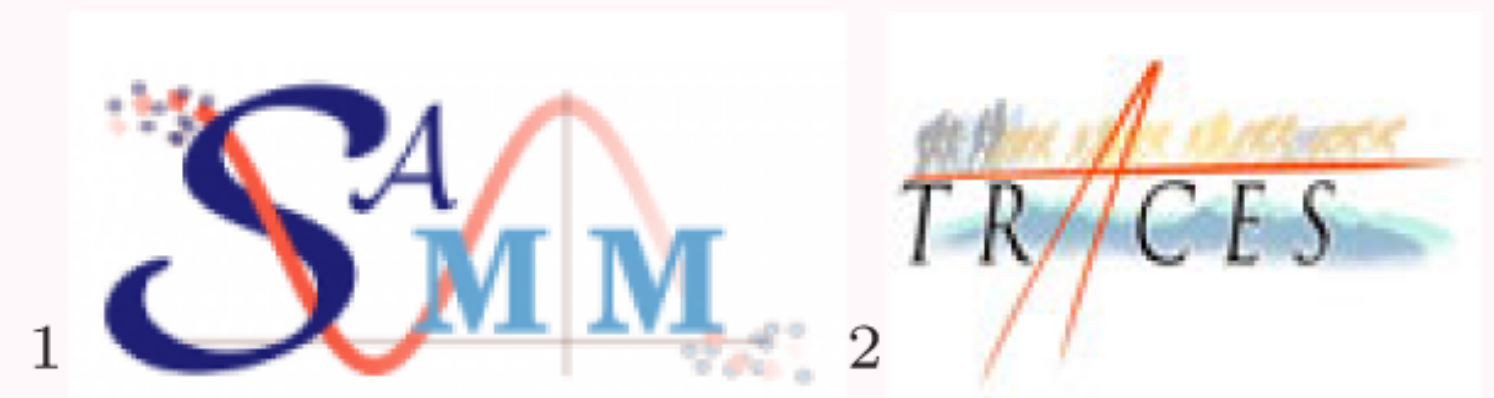

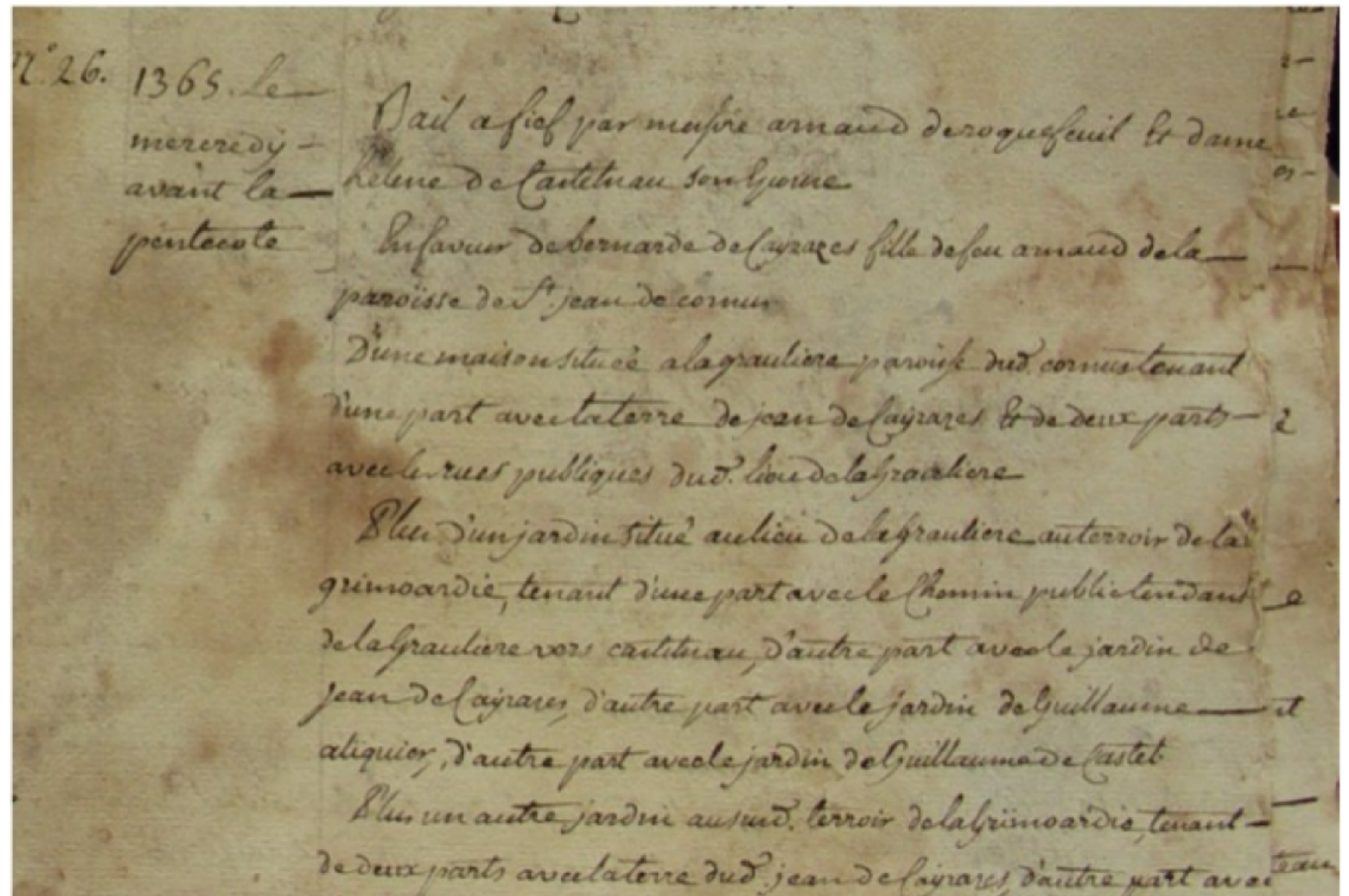
Sources

3356 notarial acts

- “Archives départementales du Lot” (Cahors, France)
- Seigneurie de Castelnau Montratier (south west of France);
- established between 1238 and 1765, mostly between 1250 and 1500;
- copied from lost sources between 1770 and 1789 to validate land claims, rents, etc. of the new owner of the Seigneurie.

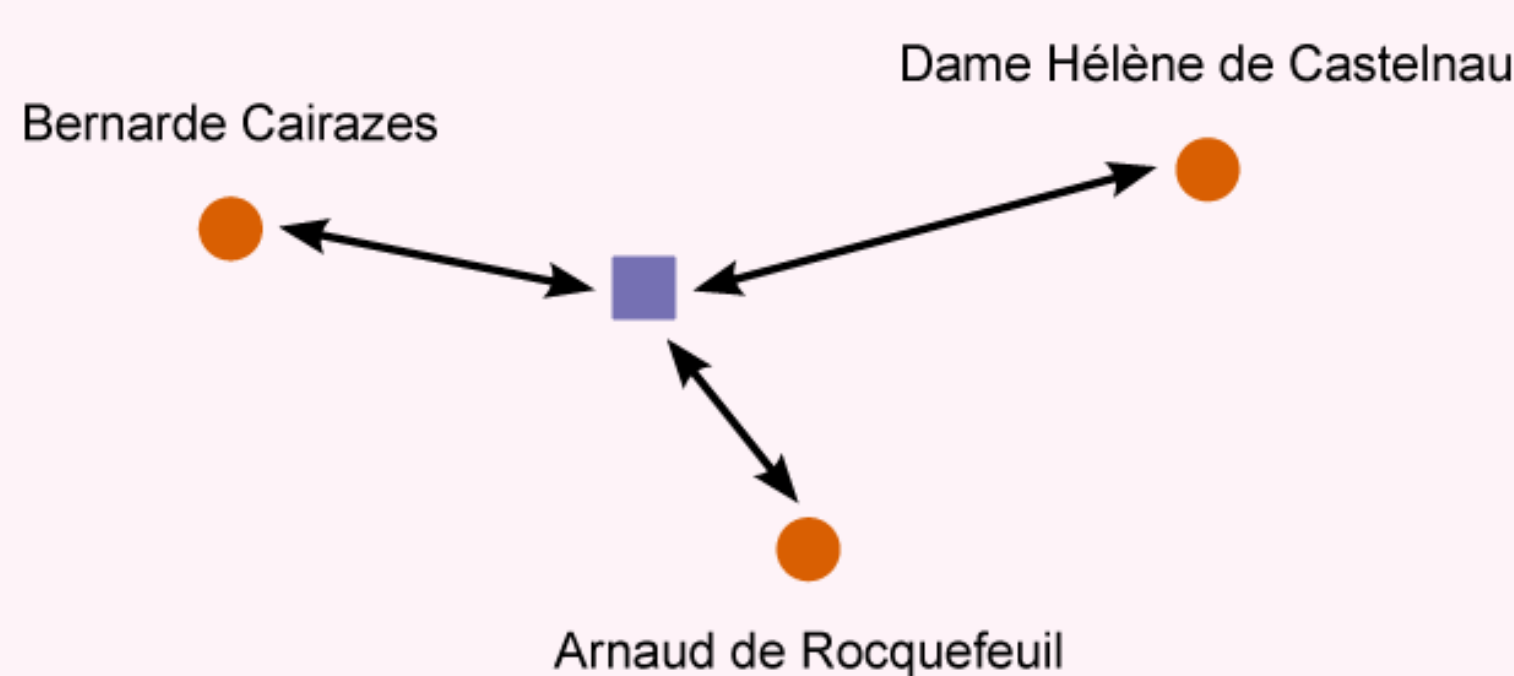

- Information: transaction date and type, rent and other compensations, locations (associated to indirectly involved persons), directly involved persons: tenant(s), lord(s), notary
- Large database: 6720 transactions in 3356 acts involving 4280 names (excluding notaries)

Network model

- vertices (nodes): persons AND transactions
- edges: citations or inclusions

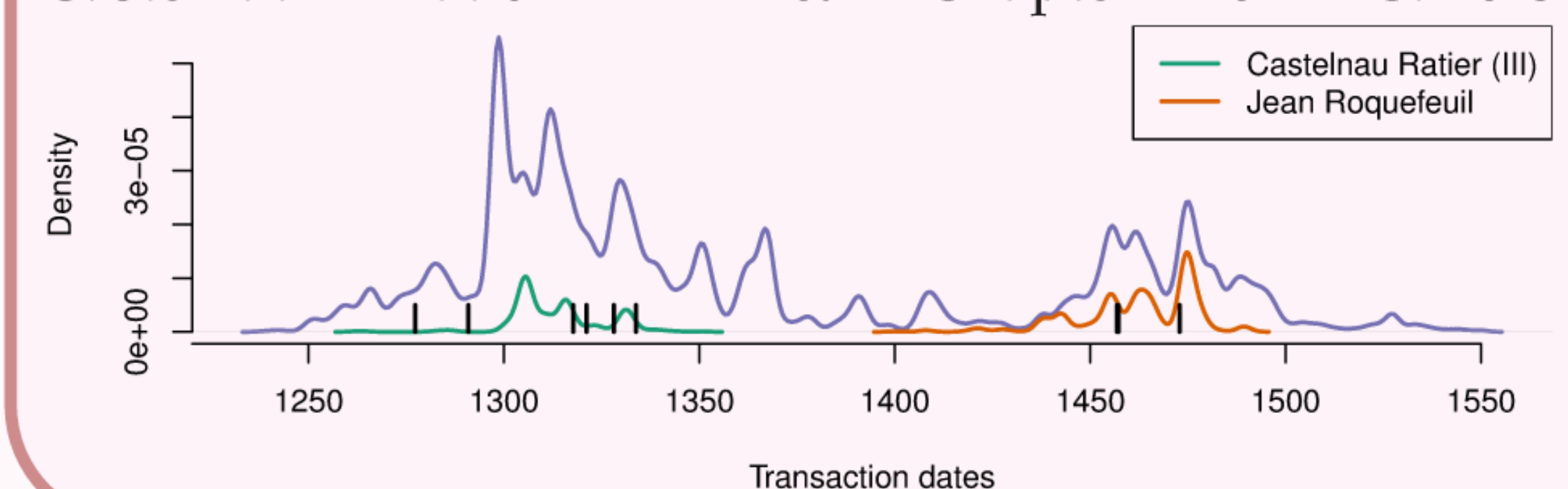


Global characteristics help identifying suspicious records

- 11000 vertices; among them, 10373 are connected.
- Power law degree distribution (e.g., 20 names associated to more than 100 transactions each and 4101 transactions together)
- 80 transactions with only one name (10 of them have “unknown” name attached)
- High degree names are sometimes suspicious (e.g., Seigneur Castelnau Ratier III involved in 329 transactions from 1262 to 1350 with probable life span from 1290 to 1350)
- Other possible transcription errors: persons with a very low degree but a very high betweenness (valid example: Chapter of Cahors but who are the other ones?)

Dates

Poor connectivity (compared to a random model) essentially associated to long life span
High betweenness nodes: Jean Roquefeuil, Castelnau Ratier III & Chapter of Cahors
